Approx 11:30 p.m. & Mom & Donna came  
home (walked) & Donna & I went out till  
2 a.m. Blf. @ Dennis on 19<sup>th</sup> & took  
kids downtown. Mom & Donna went  
sight seeing. At noon left Mom & Donna's  
& drove <sup>driving</sup> car to ski lift. Took kids on  
riding up ski lift. Then washed car  
& on to beach for afternoon & barbecue.  
Took kids downtown to see evening  
activity & home around 8:30 p.m. Mom &  
Donna came home 10 p.m. Downtown is  
down & made reservations for Little Clark show

Gambled till 11:30 p.m. On to show. Got at 2 a.m. & gambled for awhile & then home. Up next a.m. 2d & ate at Dennis' & on trip @ 9:30 a.m. the 20<sup>th</sup>.

Donna called Karpe Aug. 20 28<sup>th</sup> & talked to everyone. Soundok fine.

Sept 18<sup>th</sup> & 1:30 p.m. Mom received call from Sabra. Donna had not been to work since Sun. Sept 6<sup>th</sup> @ 2 a.m. Talked to Officer Pechick at Lake Tahoe Police Station & learned apt. had been searched 1 wk. before (for a body) Sept 11<sup>th</sup>. Every thing in order. Sabra supposedly received a phone call Sept 8<sup>th</sup>, namely "Emergency for Anna Bass in Nevada," supposedly from Nevada Sheriff Dept. Via Joanneson very sure phone call came on the 8<sup>th</sup> of Sept. said Pechick took it but Pechick did not take it until the 11<sup>th</sup> when Mr. Davis phoned & was informed of emergency.

Jo Ann G & friend came to spend Labor Day night at Donnas new apt. but no one @ Sabra would even say she was missing from work. Donna rented a new apt. the 1<sup>st</sup> of Sept. but stayed in the Lanes until Fri. night. Larry used her

car Fri nite as he had a battery go dead & was having an vacation the next a.m. (4:30 A.M. Sat) Went down @ 11:30 p.m. to Granny & said good bye. Donna was to pick up James mail & forward it to them. The envelope was made out & 2 parties of mail were in envelope. Jolann felt she was tail'd later day night when she was asking for Donna - same person all the time (sic).

Marge, Dick & myself got on Western airline @ 7 p.m. & flew to San Fran. Jolann met us @ airport @ 12:30 p.m. & drove us to Lake Tahoe getting there @ 4:30 a.m. Harry officer greeted us & knew nothing of missing persons report. Nice - d. gray haird officer came & in & was very helpful we were then assisted to her new apt. Present manager Frank let ~~us~~ us in. Bathroom light was still on. Place very neat & orderly. Cosmetics, toothbrush & case to contact lens were all there. Newley purchased articles, charged on Bank America, on the 5<sup>th</sup> wire in place. No on

at apt. had run Donna. Car was parked & locked by apt. house. Officer Tucker on at 7am. & appeared to do much to help us but mystery remained. My brother Ray & wife arrived 2pm from L.A. Went to Sahara & talked to Security. Said all they had was a partly finished letter she was writing & a letter she received from a friend.

Complete apathy of police dept appalled us. She had tried, convicted & sentenced in their books without them so much as knowing any of the plain facts. Each time we reported in we gave our name in detail & asked about Donna the new shift never so much as even had a report because they figured she was a runaway. We were told many times by them that she was fat, white & 25 & could do as she pleased. Each time we reinforced them she was a conscientious, considerate reliable friendly person who probably met i fool play which they wholeheartedly laughed @ because they experience many cases like this but 90% always return

She is a Registered Nurse & started  
work @ the Sahara Tahoe June 11<sup>th</sup>.  
Originally it was to be only a summer  
job but being offered a raise in pay  
& wanted to pursue the skiing she  
decided to get an apt. by herself &  
stay on till the 1<sup>st</sup> of the year.  
She was planning a trip to Europe  
after the 1<sup>st</sup> of the year.

Sun. morn when Vic De Vides was  
on duty we again talked i security. He  
was annoyed that we wanted Vic  
questioned because he was his #1  
security guard in the evening. He  
had dated Donna a couple of  
times & called her an "agoura" because  
he couldn't get to (I think i her). She

a more than just one couldn't get

Vic had come to duty Sun. p.m. but w-

He also dated a few times a young (son from) fellow called Tony. He was a hand writer who couldn't account all of his time. There also was a young man called Dave who worked @ Summers Standard Station, on main Hwy. right across state line.

This young man had a college degree & was very nervous. Lived in the hills & camped out even when we were out there in Sept. It was cold then & real nippy, but as then was still in the hills somewhere.

Janie (a dealer @ Harrah's) she was also ~~a~~ <sup>at</sup> short time ~~at~~ <sup>at</sup> Harrah's @ Table #26 when we were there. She knows Donna & had asked her to live in her house.

Usually 3 boys & 3 girls lived in the big mansion way up the hill & off from the left bank of the river \$750. or a mo. rent. Vic & Dwight were 2 young men who lived there. Donna & a girl named

Lili took Dwight to San Francisco for the Service.

Donna rented an apt. @ Monte Verid Apt. #6. ph. 544-5993 and stayed there only 1 night. Fri. Sept. 5<sup>th</sup> + a.m. Sat. Sat. 5<sup>th</sup>. She was known to walk to her old apt. but this new one she did drive home on Fri. night. If she walked to work Sat. I'm sure she had plans to do something because this road was dark & I'm sure she wouldn't plan to walk home @ 2 a.m. by herself. She did to the other one because it was closer & well lit until she got to the Apt. itself. Nick & Marge Davis

1200 E. Nevill Apt. 337 Walnut Creek, Calif. ph. 415-937044 were the owners of Monte Verid Apts. when Donna rented her apt. It was managed by Frank De Sineau P.O. Box 492 Zephyr Cove, Nev. 8944 He lived at the Apts. A man named Butter the new owner moved in before we left.

She was seen on Sat. as she

packed the 2nd remaining things  
 The older nurse who lived in the  
 front apt. of the other apt. had  
 seen her on Sat. (she also had  
 peculiar ways).

Janie said she would be very  
 helpful & gave all the wrong details.  
 She (although lying is vice) kept  
 saying a kick was involved.  
 Dwight kept saying she was  
 with kick. When we took her  
 to the police station @ 4<sup>30</sup> a.m.  
 Sun morn. they just grunted here  
 & off she went.

Now Dave @ the filling station  
 used to fix Donna's car all the  
 time & so she made the remark  
 sh'd keep him as a friend because  
 you never know when she might  
 need her car fixed & she told me  
 she felt in time he'd find himself  
 rampant to something but he was so  
 nervous he made her scared.  
 He did get angry one night when  
 she found him up @ her friend & she  
 went @ Tony & they met after work.

He asked her how come? & named his  
motor why Tony brought her home.  
Sgt. R. Berganson South St. Take Police  
was assigned to the case & was  
very stand offish with what ever was  
done but he did not question suspect  
before the police had a chance to.

Johnny Schott was on the night  
shift to head security. He did not  
become involved nor even try to help.  
Dennis supposedly always reported  
off to someone. She did not use  
the time clock punch clock). She  
was offered a \$50. /mo. raise &  
another \$50. was pending. When  
asked if the room was searched the  
police said so & so, oh, so & so did  
it & finally it was Johnny Schott who  
did it & he did not remember seeing  
this obvious big grocery bag & her  
underslip & uniform still i name  
tag on it. This uniform was very  
dirty looking. No obvious signs of  
molesting & definitely more dirty  
than any other. She was very neat  
in her appearance & even the fairly new  
shoes she had appeared really worn.

There was also 2 pages missing  
from her desk colored - One that  
the pages opened & lay flat so the  
pages gone were namely Sept. 6<sup>th</sup> Sun.  
Every other page was intact.
